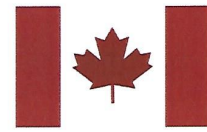

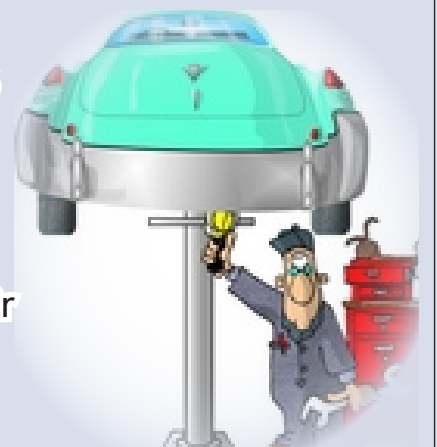

# Petitcodiac Area Garden Club

Happy Canada Day & Congratulations of the Graduating Classes of 2023!

What a wild weather ride we had in June! Thankfully the skies cleared, the sun came out, gardens are in, and everything is coming to life. The Community Garden underwent some changes this year. The lower garden is always very wet in the Spring. Thanks to the generous support of the Horizon Health Network grant programs, drainage was added to this section of the garden, along with four raised garden beds, which have all been spoken for by individual gardeners. In total, eight gardeners are using a total of 10 ground plots and another 10 are using raised gardens, for a total of 18 gardeners.

Raised beds are proving very popular with community members, both within the Community Garden and around the Village. Earlier in June, volunteers gathered to fill five raised beds placed within the community. All totaled, the Garden Club and Community Garden boast 17 raised beds. Volunteers also stopped by the Maritime Motorsport Hall of Fame and refreshed their flower gardens.



Going back to May, we want

to share that the Annual "Spring into Gardening" Plant Sale raised \$2200! Thank you to everyone for your continued support! These funds allow us to continue to maintain and expand our community gardening efforts. Congratulations to Lori Walton, the winner of the Perennial Planter draw.

Work is continuing with preparing the grounds for the Holmes Brook Observation Deck. Being mindful of the local habitat, removal of dead trees and clearing of brush to provide a clear view of the brook has been completed. In the coming weeks the Orchard Pathway extensions will begin, along with the construction of the deck and natural play park. For your safety, please avoid the areas where work is happening. Speaking of safety, please take care at the southwest corner of the existing pathway, as there was a small washout. The drainage has been repaired, and rock has been added, however, repairing the top level of gravel was delayed by weather.

Coming up next is one of our most popular events - The Annual Garden Tour. Dates are being finalized for a mid-summer tour in the Anagance/Cornhill area. ## From the Desk of Your MLA Ross Wetmore, Gagetown - Petitcodiac

I hope summer 2023 has started off well.

Every now and again I am asked questions about the proceedings and process of our legislature.

I recently spoke on the process of "Closure".

Closure is employed to limit time spent on debate and is in the 'rule book' to prevent the opposition parties from talking endlessly and slowing up government policies. I am not in favour of employing "Closure" any more than I am of talking endlessly without point and with the sole purpose of slowing proceedings to a standstill.

Here is what I had to say on the matter: Mr. Speaker: Member for Gagetown-Petitcodiac.

Mr. Wetmore: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Again, I am a man of few words. As you will notice, I do not jump up and speak on every motion. I guarantee you that if I had 15 minutes, I would not rag the puck.

I have been told that two wrongs do not make a right, and that is what we have seen. We have seen dragging on, and then we have seen closure. That is certainly not the way that it should be. I got elected for the first time in this Legislature in 2010, under the David Alward government. During that time, I believe that we brought in closure maybe once. The following time I got

elected was in 2014. And under the Gallant government, as was said by the Government House Leader, there were about seven motions to close the House.

Then 2018, under Premier Higgs with a minority government, was probably the best government that I had the opportunity to serve in. There was no closure at all.

So, 2020, and here we are today, talking about closure. I have a hard time voting for closure. I have not decided how I am going to vote, but I am having a hard time. But I do know that I have 494 days left in this Legislature because I am not reoffering. In that time, if we do not have closure, there are only 49 more days of sitting in this House and bringing legislation forward.

I was elected to be a Member of the Legislative Assembly, and a member is supposed to deal with bills and deal with legislation. I said earlier that if we are going to run on committee, then we might as well reduce the number of MLAs from 49 and run on 11.

So, that is my spiel. I am going to end. Again, I have never been in favour of closure, whether I have been a government member or whether I have been an opposition member. And I want it to be in Hansard to make sure that it is on the record for my grandchildren and great-grandchildren to see. Thank you.

## A call to arms

I struggled with the title of this article, as I wanted to call it "A call to knees", but that is a bit geeky, even for me. But I wanted to express my concern of what is happening around us, as we see so much evil happening, from drugs, thefts, bitterness, anger, division, and outright hatred.

How should a Christian respond to all of this? First, we need to understand what is happening and where the "Battle" is to be won.

Ephesians 6:12 states "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

The "Battle" is to be won on our knees. We are no match for the evil that is affecting our society in so many places. Lives are in turmoil. People live in despair, they lash out in anger, say hateful things, accuse the people around them of hateful things, people feel hopeless and unloved. Too often we as Christians don't understand that those who do such things are held captive by those "Rulers, powers and authorities" described in the passage from Ephesians.

Our duty is to go to our knees in prayer for those who appear to be our "enemies" and to "Battle" on their behalf, bringing them before God and asking for their defense. Jesus did that the same thing on the cross, during the biggest act of injustice in history, when he said "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

The Gospel is Good News for sinners. It is a message for the helpless, the hopeless, the destitute, those who are bitter, angry and at the end of their rope.

The first step in spreading the Gospel is prayer. May God's church unite itself in prayer for the world around it, and while doing so, hold up the Gospel as the beacon of Light and Hope that it really is. May the daily paper become the source for our own personal prayer list.

## Town Council News:

Salisbury Town Council has held June 12, 2023, was in response to public requests that the municipality recognize June as Pride Month in this manner. Going forward, the Town will develop a Flag Policy which may involve

the installation of a special events/acknowledgments flag pole.

Salisbury Town Council is ready to put its by-laws under the proverbial microscope. Council has supported a motion to launch a review of municipal by-laws, including proposed by-laws as well as those by-laws still in effect for Ward 3, which covers the former Village limits. Discussion at the May 23, 2023, Committee of the Whole Meeting saw Council decide on ATVs and Unsightly Premises as the immediate priorities for the by-law review Committee of Council.



to Commercial-Industrial. The applicant landowner intends to use the property for warehousing activities, general office administration work, truck/trailer/equipment repairs and maintenance, and washing/cleaning and truck/trailer parking. While no objections have been formally raised, Council has not yet decided on the request.

As part of the process of exploring for a municipal water source, Council passed a motion to authorize Administration to engage Englobe Corp. and Sigma Geophysics Inc. to undertake a geophysical survey of two potential zones identified in a 2023 Feasibility Study. The cost for this surveying is estimated at \$88,000, plus HST, budgeted as a former Village sub-unit specific expense. It was stressed that this exploratory phase comes with no guarantees.

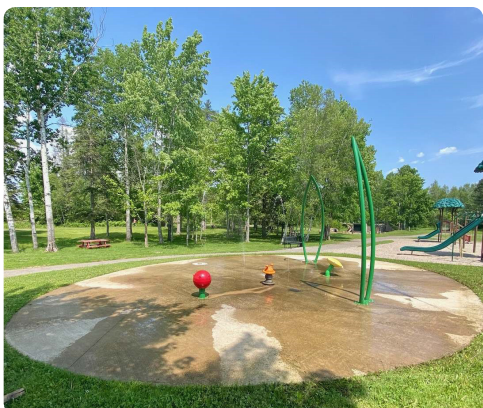

### Parking Area Adjacent to Wetland Trail

Did you know there is a designated parking area adjacent to Salisbury's Wetland Trail? The parking area is located on municipally-owned property accessible by a driveway at 33 MacDonald Road (the corner of MacDonald Road and Braemar Street). Proceed down this driveway and park on the RIGHT, please. This is very important, as the property on the left is private property and is clearly marked as such. (Violators who park on private property will be towed at their expense). In the designated parking area to the right, there is a larger parking area marked by colourfully-painted cement barriers, as well a wide lane that runs parallel to the Wetland Trail. The alternative to parking in this area would be to park at Highland Park and walk through the Park to access the Wetland Trail, which is a shared trail intended for walking, running, or riding a bicycle. Motorized vehicles are prohibited on the Wetland Trail/Highland Park (with the exception of municipal vehicles conducting maintenance).
