



RCMP's Online Crime Reporting (OCR)

gives New Brunswickers (in RCMP areas of jurisdiction), an alternate way to report certain non-emergency crimes without calling the police, or visiting a detachment.

Online crime reporting is not meant to replace other forms of reporting crime. Always call 911 in an emergency. RCMP non-emergency line is 1-888-506-RCMP.

How does it work?

- •Visit OCR website at https://ocre-sielc.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/en
- •The easy-to-use website guides you through a series of questions to give police information about your incident.
- •At the end, you will receive an email confirmation with an incident number and a report, which can be used for insurance purposes. The entire report takes about 15 minutes.
- •All reports submitted via OCR are reviewed by the RCMP, and are entered into the RCMP's record management system.
- A police officer will contact you if more information is required.

Why should I use OCR?

- Available 24/7
- •No need to visit or call a detachment
- •Provides report that can be used for insurance purposes
- •Contributes important information to assess crime trends

What can I report using OCR?

- •Mischief/damage to property under \$5,000
- •Theft under \$5,000
- Lost property

Do NOT use OCR if:

- •Stolen property includes firearms, credit cards, or personal identification (e.g. driver's licence or passport).
- •The value of stolen or damaged property exceeds \$5,000.
- •There are witnesses or video evidence of the crime.

Incidents that do not meet the criteria for OCR are directed to the RCMP's non-emergency line 1-888-506-RCMP.

Call police or 911 immediately if the incident is still in progress, or if it is an emergency.

Filing a false police report is a crime.


The sunlight filters through blessing of a full quiver. Now, what to - reminders of God's bounty? Or is that





Partridge hunting and salmon fishing on the Tobique rounded out her sports.

Her family was everything to her. Her nieces and nephews and others reaped the benefit of her love and care by taking them hiking, fishing, camping, skidooing and biking. When night fell it was board games and cards. Her work ethic was legendary and this was passed on as well. Her boss, Dr. MacLellan once said, "Pearl is the only person I knew



This survey is designed to gain relevant and valuable feedback, allowing Town Council to create an appropriate foundation to meet the public service needs of the residents of Salisbury, as well as maintain public

Salisbury Fire Rescue is getting a new pumper-tanker fire truck. Salisbury Town Council, on June 29, approved a contract award to Safety Source Fire Inc. at a cost of \$707,869.85. Just two days before, Salisbury received a Ministerial Order from the Province confirming funding approval from the Municipal Capital Borrowing Board.

Final reading for a proposed rezoning for 3058 Fredericton Road can take place at Salisbury's Regular Council Meeting on the evening of Monday, August 14. First and second reading took place on July 10. The applicant landowner is requesting the zoning be changed from Rural Area to Commercial-Industrial to allow for warehousing activities, administration work, and truck, trailer, and equipment maintenance.

Did you know fireworks cannot legally be used in Salisbury's former village limits (Ward 3) unless special permission is granted by the Town of Salisbury? COUNSELLING CONTINUES IN SALISBURY AND PETITCODIAC

Summer is here and school is out, but counselling services continue to be offered in the communities of Salisbury and Petitcodiac.

Check out the answers to these common questions to learn more about this valuable service:

Do I need a referral to go to counselling?

No, you don't need a referral to book a counselling session. You can call either the Salisbury Primary Health Care Office at 506-372-3319 or the Petitcodiac Health Centre at 506-756-3400 to book an appointment in either location.

When is the counsellor available in Salisbury and Petitcodiac?

The counsellor is in Salisbury on Wednesday and Thursday at 64 Douglas Street and in Petitcodiac on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday at the Health Centre.

What can I expect when I arrive for my session?

In Salisbury, you can just go to the door and the counsellor will greet you (knock if she isn't right there); and in Petitcodiac, you will check in with reception. You can expect the session to last about an hour.

Is there a fee for this service? No, this is a free service.


What does a counsellor help with? Answer: The counsellor can help you with any sort of mental health concern like anxiety, depression, self-esteem, anger, loneliness, or relationship issues. You talk about what you want to talk about in a safe and comfortable atmosphere where you won't be judged.

Can I see the counsellor more than once?

Absolutely. Each session stands on its own, but you're welcome to call and book another appointment anytime.

Who can go see the counsellor? Anyone; however, if you are under 16 years of age you will need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
